Terwilliger by the Numbers

Dear APAH Supporters,

Thank you for supporting APAH's Uniting to Serve capital campaign to serve neighbors in your community.
Lucille and Bruce Terwilliger Place welcomed its first residents home in July 2022. Today, 16 months later, we are honored to share an update from the community with you.

Terwilliger Place is the first APAH property where philanthropy has played a pivotal role. The Terwilliger Family Foundation provided a \$1.5 million lead gift, followed by more than 50 additional supporters and raised a total of \$4.2 million in philanthropic funds to support construction and programmatic offerings. Together, thanks to your generosity, we closed a \$3 million funding gap to make Terwilliger Place a reality.

Terwilliger Place, which maintains a 50% veteran preference, is paving the way as a replicable model that combines affordable housing and veteran services to meet community needs. We thank all who made this innovative project possible including American Legion Post 139, Arlington County, project partners, and you, our valued Uniting to Serve donors. While we reflect on the accomplishments we have made, together, we reaffirm our commitment to our vision that everyone deserves a place to call home – a foundation to live their dreams.

And, the work continues.

Terwilliger residents are supported daily by a full-time, onsite Resident Service Coordinator, Kane Donaghy. Kane is dedicated to ensuring that the residential community grows together in a positive way. Exciting programmatic and community events have been at the center of Kane's work. APAH established a free on-site household pantry where residents can access household cleaning and essential items. APAH has connected residents to the Arlington Food Assistance Center (AFAC).

Terwilliger Place: A residential community with people at the heart of its mission.

In the Fall of 2023, Terwilliger residents participated in Ready to Learn, which was co-hosted by Amazon and APAH. Parents received \$150 to spend on clothing and other needs per student. School supplies were also free for students.

A resident mom of three children couldn't believe her apartment owner was ensuring her children received school supplies. She was in tears after the event.

Terwilliger is also home to 50 veteran households.

Today's local veterans face a different reality than those who came before. The high cost of housing makes it difficult for many families to afford an adequate home.

APAH has worked tirelessly to connect veteran residents to case managers and support services at the VA. Kane works hard to mitigate residents' PTSD triggers, such as loud sounds, lighting and signage sensitivities that make these residents' day easier to navigate.

APAH has partnered with Volunteers of America and hosted specific Ready To Work Events for its Veteran residents including:

- Resume workshops
- Interview tips and follow-up support
- Mock interviews and guidance on dressing for the job

The Terwilliger Place community is excited to continue to grow together and build on its first year of success.
